UNDERSTANDING PERCENT LOSS

DERIVING THE PERCENT LOSS FORMULA

EXAMPLES OF PERCENT LOSS IN PHYSICS

EXAMPLE 1: ENERGY LOSS IN A MECHANICAL SYSTEM

IMAGINE A PULLEY SYSTEM WHERE THE INITIAL GRAVITATIONAL POTENTIAL ENERGY IS 100 JOULES. AFTER THE SYSTEM IS SET IN MOTION, DUE TO FRICTION AND AIR RESISTANCE, THE FINAL ENERGY IS MEASURED TO BE 70 JOULES. TO FIND THE PERCENT LOSS:

USING THE FORMULA:

$$\text{PERCENT LOSS} = ((100 \text{ J} - 70 \text{ J}) / 100 \text{ J}) \times 100\% = (30 \text{ J} / 100 \text{ J}) \times 100\% = 30\%$$

THIS MEANS THAT 30% OF THE ENERGY IS LOST DUE TO INEFFICIENCIES IN THE SYSTEM.

EXAMPLE 2: ELECTRICAL ENERGY LOSS

CONSIDER AN ELECTRICAL CIRCUIT WITH AN INITIAL POWER INPUT OF 50 WATTS. IF THE POWER OUTPUT MEASURED AT THE LOAD IS 40 WATTS, THE PERCENT LOSS CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{PERCENT LOSS} = ((50 \text{ W} - 40 \text{ W}) / 50 \text{ W}) \times 100\% = (10 \text{ W} / 50 \text{ W}) \times 100\% = 20\%$$

THIS INDICATES THAT 20% OF THE POWER IS LOST, WHICH COULD BE DUE TO RESISTANCE IN THE WIRES OR COMPONENTS.

COMMON SCENARIOS IN ENERGY LOSS
