WHAT DOES MU MEAN IN PHYSICS? UNVEILING THE MULTIFACETED GREEK LETTER

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UNDERSTANDING THE VERSATILE SYMBOL MU (μ)

THE GREEK LETTER MU (μ) IS ONE OF THE MOST FREQUENTLY ENCOUNTERED SYMBOLS IN THE PHYSICIST'S TOOLKIT. ITS UBIQUITY STEMS FROM ITS ADOPTION TO REPRESENT A WIDE SPECTRUM OF PHYSICAL QUANTITIES, OFTEN CHOSEN FOR HISTORICAL REASONS OR SIMPLY FOR CONVENIENCE. IT'S CRUCIAL FOR ANY STUDENT OR ENTHUSIAST OF PHYSICS TO RECOGNIZE THE CONTEXT IN WHICH MU APPEARS, AS ITS MEANING CAN DRASTICALLY CHANGE DEPENDING ON THE FIELD AND THE EQUATION IT'S PART OF. THIS ADAPTABILITY MAKES MU A POWERFUL YET POTENTIALLY CONFUSING SYMBOL, NECESSITATING A DETAILED BREAKDOWN OF ITS VARIOUS ROLES.

WHEN YOU ENCOUNTER MU IN A PHYSICS PROBLEM OR TEXT, YOUR FIRST THOUGHT SHOULD BE ABOUT THE SURROUNDING INFORMATION. IS IT ABOUT MOTION? HEAT? WAVES? THE SUBATOMIC REALM? EACH OF THESE DOMAINS MIGHT ASSIGN A DIFFERENT, YET EQUALLY VITAL, MEANING TO THIS SINGLE GREEK LETTER. THIS ARTICLE AIMS TO EQUIP YOU WITH THE KNOWLEDGE TO CONFIDENTLY INTERPRET MU IN ITS DIVERSE PHYSICAL CONTEXTS, ENHANCING YOUR COMPREHENSION OF FUNDAMENTAL PHYSICS PRINCIPLES.

MU IN MECHANICS: FRICTION AND FORCE

ONE OF THE MOST COMMON AND RELATABLE USES OF MU IN PHYSICS IS IN THE REALM OF MECHANICS, SPECIFICALLY WHEN DISCUSSING FRICTION. HERE, MU (μ) ALMOST INVARIABLY REPRESENTS THE **COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION**. FRICTION IS THE FORCE THAT OPPOSES MOTION BETWEEN TWO SURFACES IN CONTACT. THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION IS A DIMENSIONLESS QUANTITY THAT QUANTIFIES THE DEGREE OF THIS OPPOSITION. IT'S A CRUCIAL FACTOR IN DETERMINING HOW MUCH FORCE IS NEEDED TO START AN OBJECT MOVING (STATIC FRICTION) OR TO KEEP IT MOVING AT A CONSTANT VELOCITY (KINETIC FRICTION).

THE COEFFICIENT OF STATIC FRICTION (μ_s)

THE COEFFICIENT OF STATIC FRICTION, DENOTED BY μ_s , IS USED WHEN AN OBJECT IS AT REST, AND YOU ARE TRYING TO OVERCOME THE INITIAL RESISTANCE TO MOTION. THE MAXIMUM STATIC FRICTION FORCE ($F_{s,max}$) IS DIRECTLY PROPORTIONAL

TO THE NORMAL FORCE (N) PRESSING THE SURFACES TOGETHER. THE RELATIONSHIP IS GIVEN BY THE EQUATION: $F_{S,MAX} = \mu_s N$. A HIGHER μ_s INDICATES THAT MORE FORCE IS REQUIRED TO GET THE OBJECT MOVING, MEANING THE SURFACES ARE "STICKIER" OR ROUGHER IN RELATION TO EACH OTHER.

THE COEFFICIENT OF KINETIC FRICTION (μ_k)

ONCE AN OBJECT IS IN MOTION, THE FRICTION ACTING UPON IT IS KNOWN AS KINETIC FRICTION. THE COEFFICIENT OF KINETIC FRICTION IS REPRESENTED BY μ_k . SIMILAR TO STATIC FRICTION, THE KINETIC FRICTION FORCE (F_k) IS PROPORTIONAL TO THE NORMAL FORCE: $F_k = \mu_k N$. GENERALLY, μ_k IS LESS THAN μ_s FOR THE SAME PAIR OF SURFACES. THIS IS WHY IT OFTEN FEELS EASIER TO KEEP AN OBJECT SLIDING THAN IT DOES TO GET IT STARTED SLIDING IN THE FIRST PLACE. THINK ABOUT PUSHING A HEAVY BOX ACROSS THE FLOOR; THE INITIAL PUSH TO GET IT MOVING IS USUALLY THE HARDEST.

FACTORS AFFECTING THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION

IT'S IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THAT THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION ISN'T A UNIVERSAL CONSTANT FOR A GIVEN MATERIAL PAIR. IT CAN BE INFLUENCED BY SEVERAL FACTORS, INCLUDING:

- THE NATURE OF THE SURFACES IN CONTACT (ROUGHNESS, MATERIAL COMPOSITION).
- THE PRESENCE OF LUBRICANTS (LIKE OIL OR WATER) BETWEEN THE SURFACES.
- THE TEMPERATURE OF THE SURFACES.
- THE RELATIVE SPEED OF THE SURFACES (THOUGH THIS IS OFTEN A SECONDARY EFFECT FOR MANY COMMON MATERIALS).

PHYSICISTS USE THESE COEFFICIENTS TO PREDICT AND ANALYZE MOTION, DESIGN BRAKING SYSTEMS, UNDERSTAND HOW TIRES GRIP THE ROAD, AND A MYRIAD OF OTHER APPLICATIONS WHERE UNDERSTANDING THE FORCES OF RESISTANCE IS KEY.

MU IN THERMODYNAMICS: TEMPERATURE AND MOLECULAR PROPERTIES

BEYOND MECHANICS, THE SYMBOL μ FINDS ITS WAY INTO THERMODYNAMICS AND STATISTICAL MECHANICS, THOUGH WITH DIFFERENT MEANINGS. IN THIS CONTEXT, μ OFTEN RELATES TO THE MICROSCOPIC PROPERTIES OF MATTER AND THE BEHAVIOR OF GASES, PARTICULARLY IN ADVANCED TREATMENTS.

THE CHEMICAL POTENTIAL (μ)

IN THERMODYNAMICS AND PARTICULARLY IN STATISTICAL MECHANICS, μ COMMONLY REPRESENTS THE **CHEMICAL POTENTIAL**. THE CHEMICAL POTENTIAL IS A THERMODYNAMIC POTENTIAL THAT MEASURES THE POTENTIAL ENERGY THAT A GIVEN PARTICLE ADDS TO A SYSTEM WHEN IT IS INTRODUCED INTO THE SYSTEM. IT'S A MEASURE OF THE "DRIVING FORCE" BEHIND MASS TRANSFER OR PHASE TRANSITIONS. THINK OF IT AS THE ENERGY COST OR BENEFIT OF ADDING ONE MORE PARTICLE TO A SYSTEM AT CONSTANT TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE.

THE CHEMICAL POTENTIAL IS A FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPT WHEN DEALING WITH SYSTEMS COMPOSED OF MULTIPLE COMPONENTS OR WHEN CONSIDERING PROCESSES LIKE DIFFUSION, OSMOSIS, AND CHEMICAL REACTIONS. FOR A SINGLE-COMPONENT SYSTEM IN EQUILIBRIUM, THE CHEMICAL POTENTIAL IS RELATED TO THE GIBBS FREE ENERGY PER PARTICLE. FOR SYSTEMS WITH MULTIPLE COMPONENTS, IT INDICATES THE TENDENCY OF EACH COMPONENT TO MOVE FROM ONE PHASE TO ANOTHER OR TO REACT.

MU AND THE MEAN FREE PATH

IN SOME CONTEXTS, PARTICULARLY IN THE KINETIC THEORY OF GASES, μ (m) CAN ALSO BE ASSOCIATED WITH RELATED CONCEPTS LIKE VISCOSITY OR, INDIRECTLY, WITH THE MEAN FREE PATH. WHILE NOT ALWAYS DIRECTLY REPRESENTED BY m , UNDERSTANDING CONCEPTS LIKE THE MEAN FREE PATH (THE AVERAGE DISTANCE A PARTICLE TRAVELS BEFORE COLLIDING WITH ANOTHER) IS CRUCIAL FOR UNDERSTANDING FLUID DYNAMICS AND GAS BEHAVIOR, WHERE VISCOSITY (OFTEN DENOTED BY η , BUT CONCEPTUALLY LINKED) PLAYS A SIGNIFICANT ROLE. VISCOSITY ITSELF IS A MEASURE OF A FLUID'S RESISTANCE TO FLOW, AND IT IS INTIMATELY CONNECTED TO THE INTERMOLECULAR FORCES AND THE MOMENTUM TRANSFER AT THE MOLECULAR LEVEL.

MU IN ELECTROMAGNETISM: PERMEABILITY AND CONDUCTIVITY

THE ELECTROMAGNETIC SPECTRUM IS ANOTHER DOMAIN WHERE μ PLAYS A PIVOTAL ROLE, ALBEIT WITH DISTINCT DEFINITIONS RELATED TO THE MATERIAL PROPERTIES THAT INFLUENCE ELECTROMAGNETIC FIELDS.

MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY (μ)

IN ELECTROMAGNETISM, m IS MOST FAMOUSLY USED TO DENOTE **MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY**. MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY IS A MEASURE OF A MATERIAL'S ABILITY TO SUPPORT THE FORMATION OF A MAGNETIC FIELD WITHIN ITSELF. IN SIMPLER TERMS, IT DESCRIBES HOW EASILY A MAGNETIC FIELD CAN BE ESTABLISHED IN A MATERIAL. IT IS A KEY PROPERTY THAT DISTINGUISHES DIFFERENT MAGNETIC MATERIALS.

THERE ARE DIFFERENT TYPES OF MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY:

- **PERMEABILITY OF FREE SPACE (μ_0):** THIS IS A FUNDAMENTAL PHYSICAL CONSTANT REPRESENTING THE PERMEABILITY OF A VACUUM. ITS VALUE IS EXACTLY $4\pi \times 10^{-7}$ TESLA-METERS PER AMPERE.
- **RELATIVE PERMEABILITY (μ_r):** THIS IS THE RATIO OF THE MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY OF A MATERIAL TO THE PERMEABILITY OF FREE SPACE ($\mu_r = \mu / \mu_0$). IT INDICATES HOW MUCH BETTER A MATERIAL IS AT CONDUCTING MAGNETIC FLUX COMPARED TO A VACUUM. MATERIALS WITH $\mu_r > 1$ ARE FERROMAGNETIC OR PARAMAGNETIC, WHILE THOSE WITH $\mu_r < 1$ ARE DIAMAGNETIC.
- **ABSOLUTE PERMEABILITY (μ):** THIS IS THE ACTUAL MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY OF A MATERIAL, OFTEN EXPRESSED AS $\mu = \mu_r \mu_0$.

MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY IS CRITICAL IN UNDERSTANDING HOW MATERIALS INTERACT WITH MAGNETIC FIELDS, FORMING THE BASIS FOR TECHNOLOGIES LIKE ELECTROMAGNETS, TRANSFORMERS, AND MAGNETIC STORAGE DEVICES.

ELECTRICAL CONDUCTIVITY (σ)

WHILE LESS COMMON THAN PERMEABILITY, IN SOME OLDER OR SPECIALIZED TEXTS, μ (m) MIGHT OCCASIONALLY BE USED TO REPRESENT ELECTRICAL CONDUCTIVITY (OFTEN DENOTED BY σ). ELECTRICAL CONDUCTIVITY IS A MEASURE OF A MATERIAL'S ABILITY TO CONDUCT ELECTRIC CURRENT. IT IS THE RECIPROCAL OF RESISTIVITY. A MATERIAL WITH HIGH ELECTRICAL CONDUCTIVITY ALLOWS ELECTRIC CHARGE TO FLOW EASILY THROUGH IT. UNDERSTANDING CONDUCTIVITY IS FUNDAMENTAL TO DESIGNING ELECTRICAL CIRCUITS, WIRES, AND ELECTRONIC COMPONENTS.

MU IN PARTICLE PHYSICS: MUONS AND THEIR SIGNIFICANCE

STEPPING INTO THE SUBATOMIC WORLD, THE SYMBOL MU TAKES ON A COMPLETELY DIFFERENT, YET EQUALLY EXCITING, IDENTITY: THE **MUON**. THE MUON (μ^-) IS A FUNDAMENTAL PARTICLE, SIMILAR TO AN ELECTRON BUT WITH A MUCH LARGER MASS (ABOUT 207 TIMES THAT OF AN ELECTRON) AND AN UNSTABLE NATURE. IT IS A SECOND-GENERATION CHARGED LEPTON, MEANING IT'S A TYPE OF ELEMENTARY PARTICLE THAT DOES NOT EXPERIENCE THE STRONG NUCLEAR FORCE.

MUONS ARE PRODUCED IN HIGH-ENERGY PARTICLE COLLISIONS, SUCH AS THOSE OCCURRING IN PARTICLE ACCELERATORS OR WHEN COSMIC RAYS STRIKE THE EARTH'S ATMOSPHERE. THEY ARE FASCINATING FOR SEVERAL REASONS:

- **DECAY:** MUONS ARE UNSTABLE AND DECAY RELATIVELY QUICKLY INTO AN ELECTRON, AN ELECTRON ANTINEUTRINO, AND A MUON NEUTRINO. THEIR AVERAGE LIFETIME IS ABOUT 2.2 MICROSECONDS.
- **RELATIVISTIC EFFECTS:** DUE TO THEIR SHORT LIFETIME, MUONS CREATED IN THE UPPER ATMOSPHERE TRAVELING AT NEAR THE SPEED OF LIGHT WOULD NOT BE EXPECTED TO REACH THE EARTH'S SURFACE ACCORDING TO CLASSICAL PHYSICS. HOWEVER, THANKS TO TIME DILATION PREDICTED BY EINSTEIN'S THEORY OF SPECIAL RELATIVITY, THEIR INTERNAL CLOCKS SLOW DOWN FROM OUR PERSPECTIVE, ALLOWING A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF THEM TO SURVIVE THE JOURNEY. THIS IS A CLASSIC EXPERIMENTAL VERIFICATION OF RELATIVISTIC TIME DILATION.
- **STANDARD MODEL OF PARTICLE PHYSICS:** MUONS ARE A KEY COMPONENT OF THE STANDARD MODEL, AND THEIR PROPERTIES ARE PRECISELY MEASURED AND COMPARED WITH THEORETICAL PREDICTIONS. ANY DEVIATION COULD HINT AT NEW PHYSICS BEYOND THE STANDARD MODEL.
- **MUON G-2 EXPERIMENT:** THIS EXPERIMENT AT FERMILAB IS CURRENTLY MEASURING THE MAGNETIC DIPOLE MOMENT OF THE MUON WITH UNPRECEDENTED PRECISION. DISCREPANCIES BETWEEN THE EXPERIMENTAL RESULTS AND THEORETICAL CALCULATIONS COULD BE A STRONG INDICATION OF THE EXISTENCE OF NEW, UNDISCOVERED PARTICLES OR FORCES.

THE STUDY OF MUONS CONTINUES TO BE A VIBRANT AREA OF RESEARCH, PUSHING THE BOUNDARIES OF OUR UNDERSTANDING OF FUNDAMENTAL PARTICLES AND FORCES.

MU IN STATISTICS AND DATA ANALYSIS WITHIN PHYSICS

IN THE ANALYTICAL ASPECTS OF PHYSICS, PARTICULARLY WHEN DEALING WITH EXPERIMENTAL DATA AND STATISTICAL ANALYSIS, MU (μ) FREQUENTLY REPRESENTS THE **POPULATION MEAN**. THIS IS A STANDARD NOTATION BORROWED FROM GENERAL STATISTICS.

WHEN PHYSICISTS COLLECT DATA FROM AN EXPERIMENT, THEY ARE OFTEN INTERESTED IN THE TRUE AVERAGE VALUE OF THE QUANTITY THEY ARE MEASURING. THIS TRUE AVERAGE, ACROSS ALL POSSIBLE MEASUREMENTS (THE ENTIRE POPULATION OF DATA), IS REPRESENTED BY μ . THE MEAN CALCULATED FROM A SPECIFIC SAMPLE OF DATA IS USUALLY DENOTED BY $\bar{x}$ (X-BAR) AND SERVES AS AN ESTIMATE OF THE POPULATION MEAN μ .

UNDERSTANDING THE POPULATION MEAN IS CRUCIAL FOR:

- INTERPRETING EXPERIMENTAL RESULTS.
- DETERMINING THE ACCURACY AND PRECISION OF MEASUREMENTS.
- PERFORMING HYPOTHESIS TESTING.
- CALCULATING PROBABILITIES AND CONFIDENCE INTERVALS.

FOR INSTANCE, IF A PHYSICIST IS MEASURING THE WAVELENGTH OF A SPECTRAL LINE, THEY WILL TAKE MULTIPLE MEASUREMENTS.

THE AVERAGE OF THESE MEASUREMENTS ($\bar{x}$) WILL BE USED AS AN ESTIMATE OF THE TRUE WAVELENGTH (λ), AND STATISTICAL METHODS WILL BE APPLIED TO ASSESS THE UNCERTAINTY IN THIS ESTIMATE.

THE BROADER SIGNIFICANCE OF MU IN SCIENTIFIC NOTATION

BEYOND THESE SPECIFIC PHYSICAL QUANTITIES, THE GREEK LETTER MU (μ) ALSO PLAYS A ROLE IN THE BROADER SYSTEM OF SCIENTIFIC NOTATION AND PREFIXES. SPECIFICALLY, IT IS USED TO DENOTE THE PREFIX "MICRO," MEANING ONE-MILLIONTH (10^{-6}).

THIS PREFIX IS INCREDIBLY USEFUL FOR EXPRESSING VERY SMALL QUANTITIES ENCOUNTERED IN PHYSICS:

- **MICROMETERS (μm):** USED TO MEASURE THE WAVELENGTH OF VISIBLE LIGHT OR THE SIZE OF MICROSCOPIC OBJECTS.
- **MICROSECONDS (μs):** USED TO MEASURE THE LIFETIME OF SHORT-LIVED PARTICLES OR THE DURATION OF RAPID EVENTS.
- **MICROFARADS (μF):** A COMMON UNIT FOR CAPACITANCE IN ELECTRONICS.
- **MICROSTATES:** IN STATISTICAL MECHANICS, A MICROSTATE REFERS TO A SPECIFIC CONFIGURATION OF A SYSTEM, AND THE NUMBER OF MICROSTATES CAN BE INCREDIBLY LARGE, OFTEN DEALT WITH USING LOGARITHMS.

THE CONSISTENT USE OF "MICRO" WITH THE PREFIX M SIMPLIFIES SCIENTIFIC COMMUNICATION AND ALLOWS FOR CONCISE REPRESENTATION OF EXTREMELY SMALL MEASUREMENTS AND VALUES. THIS STANDARDIZATION IS A TESTAMENT TO THE EFFICIENCY AND ELEGANCE OF SCIENTIFIC NOTATION.

AS WE'VE EXPLORED, THE HUMBLE GREEK LETTER MU IS A POWERHOUSE OF MEANING IN PHYSICS. WHETHER IT'S THE FRICTION RESISTING YOUR EVERY MOVE, THE FUNDAMENTAL PROPERTIES OF MATERIALS, THE FLEETING EXISTENCE OF MUONS, OR THE STATISTICAL HEART OF YOUR EXPERIMENTAL DATA, MU IS THERE. ITS MULTIFACETED NATURE UNDERSCORES THE INTERCONNECTEDNESS OF DIFFERENT PHYSICS DISCIPLINES AND THE INGENIOUS WAYS SCIENTISTS USE SYMBOLS TO ENCAPSULATE COMPLEX IDEAS. SO, THE NEXT TIME YOU SEE μ , REMEMBER THAT ITS MEANING IS RICH, VARIED, AND ESSENTIAL TO OUR UNDERSTANDING OF THE PHYSICAL UNIVERSE.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT WHAT DOES MU MEAN IN PHYSICS

Q: WHAT IS THE MOST COMMON MEANING OF MU IN INTRODUCTORY PHYSICS?

A: IN INTRODUCTORY PHYSICS, THE MOST COMMON MEANING OF MU (μ) IS THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION, WHICH QUANTIFIES THE RESISTANCE TO MOTION BETWEEN TWO SURFACES. IT IS TYPICALLY SEEN IN EQUATIONS RELATED TO STATIC AND KINETIC FRICTION.

Q: IS THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION THE SAME FOR ALL MATERIALS?

A: NO, THE COEFFICIENT OF FRICTION (μ) IS SPECIFIC TO THE PAIR OF MATERIALS IN CONTACT. DIFFERENT COMBINATIONS OF SURFACES WILL HAVE DIFFERENT COEFFICIENTS, WHICH DEPEND ON FACTORS LIKE ROUGHNESS AND MATERIAL COMPOSITION.

Q: WHAT IS CHEMICAL POTENTIAL, AND WHY IS IT REPRESENTED BY MU?

A: CHEMICAL POTENTIAL (μ) IN THERMODYNAMICS REPRESENTS THE CHANGE IN A SYSTEM'S ENERGY WHEN ONE PARTICLE IS ADDED, WHILE KEEPING TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE CONSTANT. IT'S A FUNDAMENTAL CONCEPT FOR UNDERSTANDING PHASE TRANSITIONS AND CHEMICAL REACTIONS AND IS REPRESENTED BY MU FOR HISTORICAL AND SYMBOLIC REASONS WITHIN THE FIELD.

Q: HOW DOES MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY RELATE TO MU?

A: MAGNETIC PERMEABILITY (μ) IN ELECTROMAGNETISM IS A MEASURE OF A MATERIAL'S ABILITY TO SUPPORT THE FORMATION OF A MAGNETIC FIELD. THE SYMBOL μ IS USED TO DENOTE THIS PROPERTY, AND IT'S CRUCIAL FOR UNDERSTANDING HOW MATERIALS RESPOND TO MAGNETIC FIELDS.

Q: WHAT IS A MUON AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT IN PHYSICS?

A: A MUON IS A FUNDAMENTAL SUBATOMIC PARTICLE, SIMILAR TO AN ELECTRON BUT MUCH HEAVIER AND UNSTABLE. IT'S IMPORTANT BECAUSE ITS STUDY HELPS VERIFY THEORIES LIKE SPECIAL RELATIVITY (THROUGH TIME DILATION) AND PROBES FOR NEW PHYSICS BEYOND THE STANDARD MODEL.

Q: WHEN MU REFERS TO THE POPULATION MEAN IN STATISTICS, HOW IS IT DIFFERENT FROM THE SAMPLE MEAN?

A: THE POPULATION MEAN (μ) REPRESENTS THE TRUE AVERAGE OF A QUANTITY ACROSS AN ENTIRE INFINITE SET OF POSSIBILITIES, WHEREAS THE SAMPLE MEAN (OFTEN DENOTED AS $\bar{x}$) IS THE AVERAGE CALCULATED FROM A FINITE SUBSET OF THAT DATA AND SERVES AS AN ESTIMATE OF THE POPULATION MEAN.

Q: CAN MU REPRESENT MORE THAN ONE CONCEPT WITHIN THE SAME BRANCH OF PHYSICS?

A: WHILE LESS COMMON, IN VERY SPECIALIZED CONTEXTS OR HISTORICAL TEXTS, MU MIGHT HAVE SUBTLE VARIATIONS IN MEANING. HOWEVER, TYPICALLY, THE SURROUNDING EQUATIONS AND CONTEXT MAKE THE INTENDED MEANING OF MU CLEAR WITHIN A SPECIFIC FIELD.

Q: WHAT DOES THE PREFIX 'MICRO' HAVE TO DO WITH THE SYMBOL MU?

A: THE PREFIX 'MICRO' (MEANING 10^{-6} , OR ONE-MILLIONTH) IS REPRESENTED BY THE GREEK LETTER MU (μ). SO, QUANTITIES LIKE MICROMETER (MM) OR MICROSECOND (MS) USE MU TO DENOTE THIS VERY SMALL SCALE.
