DEFINITION OF GENDER ROLES IN PSYCHOLOGY REFERS TO THE EXPECTATIONS AND BEHAVIORS THAT SOCIETY ATTRIBUTES TO INDIVIDUALS BASED ON THEIR GENDER. 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UNDERSTANDING GENDER ROLES

FROM THE TOYS CHILDREN ARE GIVEN TO THE ACTIVITIES THEY ARE ENCOURAGED TO PURSUE, SOCIETY INSTILLS CERTAIN EXPECTATIONS FOR BEHAVIOR BASED ON GENDER. FOR INSTANCE, BOYS MIGHT BE ENCOURAGED TO ENGAGE IN COMPETITIVE SPORTS, WHILE GIRLS MAY BE STEERED TOWARD NURTURING ACTIVITIES SUCH AS PLAYING WITH DOLLS.

ONE CRITICAL ASPECT OF GENDER ROLES IS THEIR FLUIDITY; THEY CAN VARY SIGNIFICANTLY ACROSS DIFFERENT CULTURES AND TIME PERIODS. WHAT IS CONSIDERED APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR FOR A MAN OR WOMAN IN ONE CULTURE MAY BE VIEWED ENTIRELY DIFFERENTLY IN ANOTHER. THE ROLE OF SOCIALIZATION

SOCIALIZATION PLAYS A CRUCIAL ROLE IN THE REINFORCEMENT OF GENDER ROLES. FROM A YOUNG AGE, CHILDREN LEARN WHAT IS EXPECTED OF THEM THROUGH THEIR INTERACTIONS WITH FAMILY, PEERS, AND MEDIA. FOR EXAMPLE, BOYS MAY RECEIVE MORE PRAISE FOR BEING ASSERTIVE, WHILE GIRLS MIGHT BE REWARDED FOR BEING COOPERATIVE AND NURTURING.

EXAMPLES OF GENDER ROLES

GENDER ROLES MANIFEST IN VARIOUS DOMAINS OF LIFE, INCLUDING FAMILY DYNAMICS, EDUCATION, AND THE WORKPLACE. HERE ARE SOME COMMON EXAMPLES:

FACTORS INFLUENCING GENDER ROLES

IMPACT OF GENDER ROLES ON IDENTITY
