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INTRODUCTION TO REGRESSION IN PSYCHOLOGY

WHEN INDIVIDUALS ENCOUNTER STRESSORS THAT THREATEN THEIR SENSE OF SECURITY OR SELF-ESTEEM, THEY OFTEN REVERT TO BEHAVIORS FROM THESE EARLIER STAGES. FOR EXAMPLE, AN ADULT FACING A SIGNIFICANT LIFE CHANGE MIGHT EXHIBIT CHILDISH BEHAVIORS, SUCH AS TEMPER TANTRUMS OR DEPENDENCY ON OTHERS.

OVER THE YEARS, MANY PSYCHOLOGISTS HAVE EXPANDED ON FREUD'S INITIAL IDEAS, INCORPORATING REGRESSION INTO VARIOUS THERAPEUTIC FRAMEWORKS. 4. SOCIAL REGRESSION

SOCIAL REGRESSION MANIFESTS AS A RETREAT FROM SOCIAL INTERACTIONS OR A REVERSION TO EARLIER SOCIAL BEHAVIORS. FOR EXAMPLE, AN ADULT MAY ISOLATE THEMSELVES OR SEEK COMFORT ONLY FROM CLOSE FAMILY MEMBERS, ABANDONING FRIENDSHIPS OR SOCIAL ENGAGEMENTS. THIS BEHAVIOR OFTEN REFLECTS A DESIRE FOR SAFETY AND FAMILIARITY IN TIMES OF DISTRESS.

CAUSES OF REGRESSION

VARIOUS FACTORS CAN TRIGGER REGRESSION IN INDIVIDUALS. UNDERSTANDING THESE CAUSES IS ESSENTIAL FOR RECOGNIZING WHEN REGRESSION MAY OCCUR AND HOW TO ADDRESS IT EFFECTIVELY.

EFFECTS OF REGRESSION

WHEN A PREVIOUSLY TOILET-TRAINED CHILD BEGINS WETTING THE BED AFTER A STRESSFUL EVENT, SUCH AS A DIVORCE OR A FAMILY MOVE, THIS IS A CLASSIC EXAMPLE OF REGRESSION. THE CHILD SEEKS COMFORT IN FAMILIAR BEHAVIORS DURING A TIME OF EMOTIONAL UPEHAVAL.

3. OVERDEPENDENCE ON PARENTS

ADULTS WHO EXPERIENCE SIGNIFICANT LIFE CHANGES, LIKE LOSING A JOB, MAY RETURN TO THEIR PARENTS' HOME AND RELY HEAVILY ON THEM FOR EMOTIONAL AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT. THIS BEHAVIOR REFLECTS SOCIAL REGRESSION, SEEKING SAFETY AND COMFORT IN FAMILIAR RELATIONSHIPS.

CONCLUSION
