Anyone who loves Dr. Seuss or is interested in philosophy will find this book to be intriguing and enlightening.

Cohen also explores the themes that recur in well-known Seuss stories (like the importance of the imagination or the perils of greed). With a color palette enhanced beyond the limitations of the original magazines, this is a collection that no Seuss fan (whether scholar or second grader) will want to miss.
